On behalf of the Broad Run Ridge Homeowner's Association, I wanted to thank you and Clean-Flo for your help in restoring our pond. When I first contacted you two years ago, our pond was in poor shape with extensive algae coverage. I'm happy to report that we now have a beautiful pond with minimal algae in only our second full season using the Clean-Flo aeration system and products.

As you know, we have a 3+ acre, man-made and spring fed pond that is about twenty years old. It is relatively shallow with a depth of about six feet at center and has been steadily filling in with muck over the years including leaves, goose droppings, and other organic matter. About ten years ago, we started to see our first algae, and several years later, the algae had advanced to the


point where 90% of the pond was covered with a thick, algae blanket for the majority of the spring to fall growing season.

We attempted to control this algae with increasing aggressive and expensive chemical treatments. For several seasons, we spent in excess of \$4000 on treatments with absolutely no impact on the algae growth.

We installed the Clean-Flo aeration system in March, 2007 and noticed an immediate reduction of algae during the 2007 season. The algae coverage dropped from over 90% of the surface to about 60%.
